



# Week 8: Build a Boat



## Your Objective:

Build a boat that floats and can carry cargo without sinking. How much cargo can you carry?

#### You CAN:

- Build any kind of raft or boat you want, any size you want.
- Use any body of water that makes testing your boat fun and easy: pool, lake, plastic container, sink or tub.
- Use common household materials to build your boat. Examples include: aluminum foil, straws, popsicle sticks, rubber bands, tape string, twigs and anything you think will float.

#### You CAN'T:

Use an item for the main body of your boat without somehow changing it first. No bowls, Tupperware, toy boats or anything pre-made that resembles the shape of a boat and already floats.

Once you build a boat that floats, see how much cargo it can carry. Pennies and other coins make excellent cargo.

## How to avoid angry parents:

#### DO:

- Keep the water where it belongs.
- Dry up any splashes.
- Remove your boat and cargo from the water when you're done - even if it sank.

#### DON'T:

- Get water everywhere.
- Use cargo that can't get wet.
- Take pennies or other coins from someone without asking first.



## Take a video of your boat.

Create a video of your solution. Try to keep your video under 1-minute long and include the following:

- The name of your solution.
- How does it work?
- What kind of materials did you use?
- Did you have any problems figuring out the solution?
- What was the biggest lesson you learned?
